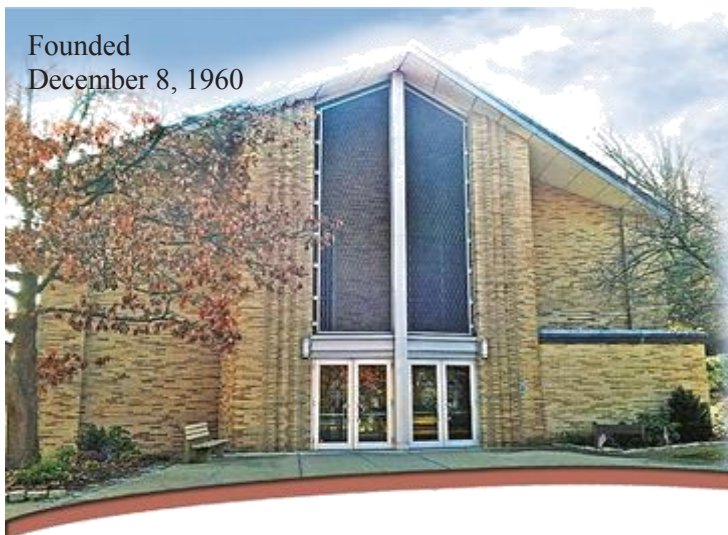

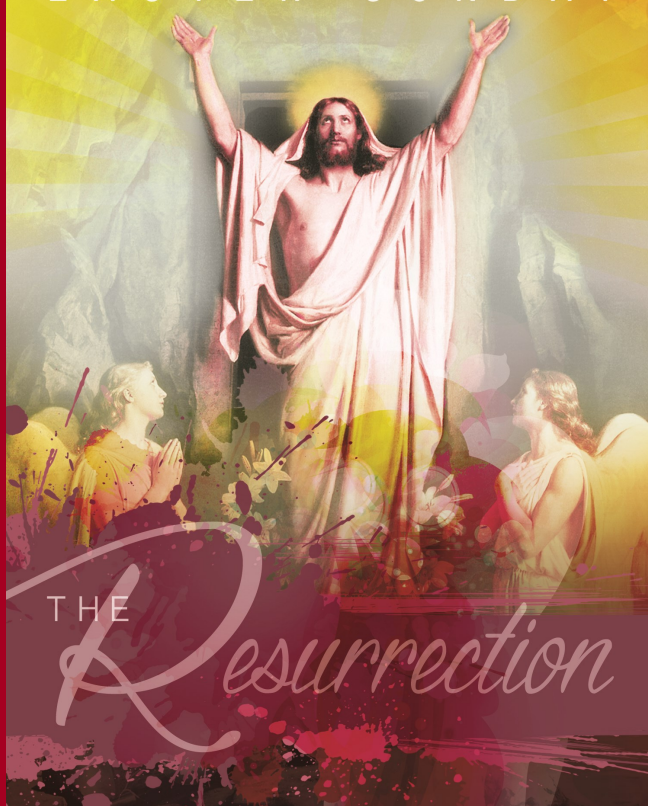

FROM THE DESK OF FATHER MIKE . . .

EASTER—THE GREAT EXCHANGE

In an instructive short story by the famous Russian writer Leo Tolstoy, he tells of a fierce king who asked the priests and intelligentsia of the royal court to show him God so that he could literally see God with his own eyes. However, these wise men admitted their limitations and explained to the king that they were in no position to satisfy his desire.

At that moment a poor and simple shepherd happened on the scene and offered to take on the task the king had entrusted to his experts. And from the humble shepherd, the king learned that his royal eyes were not sufficient to see God. Nevertheless, the king was persistent and insisted to the shepherd that if he could not see God, then he at least wanted to know what God did.

As the story progresses the shepherd replied that in order for the king to know what God did, the king and shepherd would have to exchange clothes. The king consented and gave his royal garments to the poor shepherd and then dressed himself in the simple and soiled outfit of the poor man. Then, from the shepherd's mouth came the answer: "This... this is exactly what God does!"

As we celebrate Easter, Tolstoy's story can help us to appreciate its true meaning. On Good Friday, Jesus clothed Himself with the corruption of human nature and the death our souls must suffer as the result of sin. However, at the same time that He takes unto Himself out sinfulness, He offers on Easter to clothe us in His resurrected glory. Such is the great exchange of Easter effected through our celebration and reception of the Paschal Sacraments! May we be grateful for the opportunity to shed that which has marred our beauty in exchange for a share in the resurrected glory of Jesus Christ.
