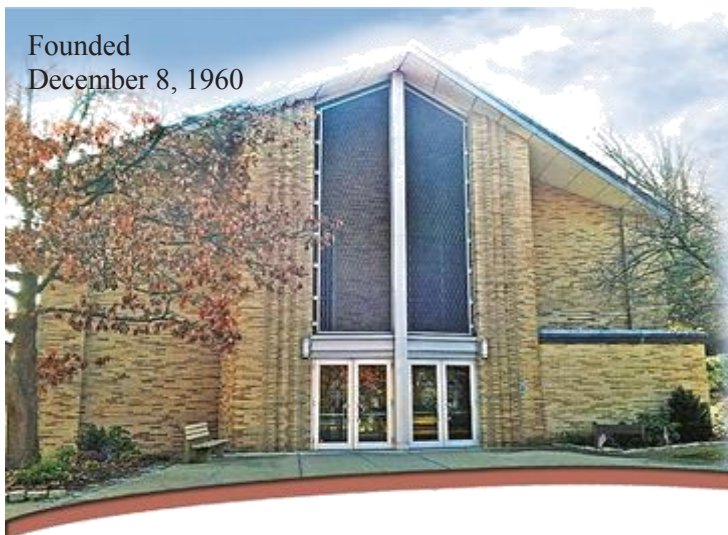

SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY #162

Acts 15:1-2 Revelation 21:10-14 John 11:23-29

HOW WILL THEY KNOW?...They will know we are disciples of Jesus by the way we love one another. We are called to love one another as Jesus loves us, totally and unconditionally. This is the greatest love known, a love that gives life, grace and peace to all around us. It is a love that is to be extended to all people. This is how we give glory to God. It is not about the external signs we wear that may point to our Christianity. It is always about the love that flows from the depths of our hearts, the love with which we reach out to others in the name and the person of Christ. So we might ask ourselves each day this very profound yet simple question: Got Love? Jesus always has love for us. Do we have that same love for others?

ON MISSION FOR THE CHURCH ALIVE! *As I Have Loved You, So You Also Should Love One Another.*

When Jesus is asked what the greatest commandment is, his response is to love God above all and to love our neighbor as our self. As Christians, this is what we strive for every day. We work to have our hearts formed so that in all things, at all times and in all circumstances we can show love for God and love for others. This commandment to love, however, is not something we have to learn on our own. In today's Gospel, Jesus invite us to love others as he has loved us. This invitation offers a beautiful moment of reflection to recognize how he has loved us. He has given us life, gifts and talents, family and friends to love us, and faith that we may realize with trust that we are never alone. The love of Jesus for us is unconditional and sacrificial and the more we reflect on love this love the more we realize how we are called to love one another. While this call of Jesus should inspire us to open our eyes and ears to see and hear the needs of others and to respond in love, it also should lead us to love others even when there is no particular reason to, simply because they are our sisters and brothers. As the *On Mission for the Church Alive!* initiative calls us to building God's Kingdom, may it be rooted in the opportunities we have to love others as God loves us. 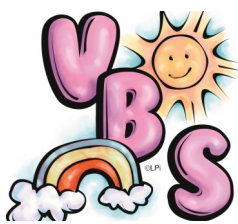

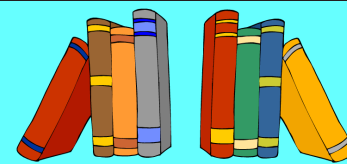
